

A Message from Rabbi Brodkin

December, 2025 Kislev, 5786

Dear Friends,

Over the past couple of years, a new tradition has emerged organically in our community. Each Chanukah, families share photos on our WhatsApp group — pictures of families gathered around the menorah, tables glowing.

Through these pictures, we get a window into one another's Jewish homes. It's hard to imagine a warmer image of Jewish life than these moments around the menorah.

As we experience the short days of Kislev and prepare to light our own candles, these images remind us of the light we bring into the world — even at a challenging time for our people.

Across the world, we hear a growing refrain of anti-Zionism, an idea that has gained traction in diverse corners of society. This leads us to an important question: is anti-Zionism simply a modern form of antisemitism? To understand this, we need to take a step back into our story.

From the dawn of our history, the Jewish people have been bound to the Land of Israel. When God called to Avram, "Lech Lecha — go forth to the land that I will show you," our national journey began.

For thousands of years, wherever Jews have lived, we have turned toward Eretz Yisrael in prayer. This gesture has linked us across continents and centuries, reminding us that Zion is a core dimension of Judaism — woven into our prayers, our past, and our future as a people.

Chanukah brings this connection into sharp focus. The Maccabees fought not only for Torah and mitzvos but also for the dignity of living as Jews in our own land. The letters on the dreidel hint at a miracle that unfolded not in an abstract setting but in a very specific place — the Land of Israel.

That is why Zionism is not a political slogan but a moral principle — the belief that the Jewish people have

the same basic right as every other nation: to live freely in their ancestral home.

To oppose the Jewish connection to Zion is to deny a core part of who we are as a people. When someone attacks that bond, they're not engaging in abstract debate — they're rejecting the very identity of the people of Zion. And that, at its root, is the essence of antisemitism.

But Chanukah reminds us that light has a way of growing even in difficult moments. It's a time when serving God and feeling proud to be Jewish naturally come together.

Chanukah may be a minor holiday, but it expresses a major principle. Each night as we light the menorah, we're making a profound statement: we are connected to HaShem, to the Jewish people, and to the Land of Israel at the heart of our

Here at B'nai Israel, we strive to be a place of Jewish pride, warmth, mitzvos, and belonging all year long. Our lobby is brighter and more welcoming. Our building is more secure, our machzors are new, and the Bloom Shabbos House provides a warm place for visiting families. Even our new roof — simple as it may sound — reminds us that a home must be safe and secure.

But what truly makes CBI feel like home is not just what has been built — it's the life that fills it. And for me, that comes alive most clearly through my own family.

Each Shabbat, I watch my daughter Maya play in the kids' room with her friends and then proudly join them on the bimah to lead Adon Olam and Hatikva. I see the joy and confidence this community gives her, and I know she is growing up rooted in Jewish life.

I see my husband Scott, energized by his first trip to Israel, practicing his Hebrew reading with Rabbi Brodkin. I feel the pride he carries when he is called to the Torah as a Levi.

I think of my son Ari, who at twenty-one lives with the challenges of autism and bipolar disorder, and yet is welcomed each week with open arms. The love and patience he receives from our community is a gift beyond measure — a reminder that every person has a place in our Jewish home.



And lastly, I think of myself. After a long week, I come to CBI on Shabbos and find something rare and precious: a reprieve. A moment to breathe. A chance to reflect on how blessed I am to be part of such a warm and loving community.

This is what our Synagogue means. This is what makes a place feel like home.

And it's not just my family — it's all of us. We see it in the twenty-plus new families who have joined us in

the past three years. We feel it at bar mitzvahs, auf rufs, and baby namings. We feel it in the leadership of Rabbi and Aviel Brodkin, who have brought creativity, outreach, and fresh vision to our community. Friends, we are building momentum. We are building a Jewish future here in Manalapan. And we are building it together.




Capital Campaign Launch

Standing with Israel: Stories, Solidarity & Hope

Throughout our history, our Congregation has been a steadfast source of support and activism for Israel. Recent months have been no different, as B'nai Israel continues to stand with Israel through tefillah, learning, community gatherings, and acts of solidarity both here and abroad.



Ron & Florence Gorsky recently returned from a powerful visit to Israel, where they witnessed firsthand the aftermath of October 7.

Their trip included Hostage Square in Tel Aviv, with its clock marking the days hostages have been held in Gaza, and

Kibbutz Nir Oz, where they saw the Bibas home and the devastation left in the wake of the attack.

They also walked through fields of bullet-riddled cars collected from the massacre sites. Guided through Nir Oz and the Nova Festival grounds by survivor Amit Musaei, they heard emotional stories of heroism and loss. At Shuva Junction, they saw volunteers serving over 1,000 soldiers daily. Amid the pain, the Gorskys were inspired by

the resilience and determination of

Israelis rebuilding their communities.

Closer to home, members of our Shul joined the Federation-led 10/7 Memorial — a moving gathering that affirmed our unity and shared commitment to Israel. Days later, we witnessed the release of hostages, including Omri Miran. Back in July 2024, our community held a challah bake in his merit while he was still in captivity.

Seeing him return home is especially meaningful in light of our prayers for him and for all the hostages. May our continued tefillot bring strength, healing, and hope to Am Yisrael.


